# Getting to know our City County Councillors for Ivy Hills... Representing the Lawrence side of Ivy Hills, Ginny Cain

Spring Greetings Ivy Hills Neighbors!

It is an honor serving as your City County Councillor for District 5. I so appreciate being entrusted with my 3rd, 4 year term on the CCC, thank you! I enjoyed visiting with many of you as I walked for the Cain Campaign. As a 4th generation Indianapolis resident, I love my City and have deep roots here. Growing up, I lived in Devonshire on Green Leaves Road, and attended Eastwood Junior High and North Central High School. My best friend lived in Ivy Hills:)

People often ask me, "What does a City County Councillor do?"

For each level of government (federal, state and local) there is the executive, legislative and judicial branch. For Indianapolis, the CCC is the legislative branch. Because the county and city are combined in Indianapolis, I am a city and county councillor. The Council has oversight over the budget (just under \$1 billion dollars for 2012), can enact local laws, called ordinances, as well as be the deciding body on zoning appeals. Notice how I spell "councillor?" We have an ordinance that made that the official spelling to remedy the councilman/councilwoman dilemma. There are 29 councillors. 25 district councillors and 4 at-large. District 5 is roughly from Castleton out to Geist with 75th Street being the southern border. It is a part time position and the salary is around \$15,000.

Each councillor is assigned to committees by council leadership. I currently serve on *Metropolitan-Economic Development Committee*, *Ethics Committee* and *Department of Public Works Committee*.

My favorite part of being a councillor is working with my constituents to resolve questions and problems. A majority of these issues have to do with infrastructure: <u>pot holes</u>, <u>drainage</u>, <u>repaving road needs</u>, <u>sidewalks</u>, <u>bridges</u>, etc.. It is always rewarding for me to get a request and see a tangible result happen that improves the area.

I had the privilege of serving as Public Works Chair during the busiest infrastructure year in Indy's history. This was thanks to the funds from the sale of the water and sewer facilities to Citizens Gas for \$425 million dollars.

Please know I am here if I can ever be of help. You have a beautiful, thriving neighborhood in Ivy Hills and that is because you all care and are active. It is an honor to serve you!

# FROM THE KITCHEN OF

# Jimmy Goetz Who doesn't need a great Marinara Sauce?!

#### Marinara Sauce

#### Ingredients:

2 tablespoons olive oil 1 medium onion

4-5 cloves garlic (finely chopped)

1 (28oz can) tomatoes (whole *San Marzano* tomatoes recommended)

1 tablespoon oregano (dried)
1 tablespoon basil (dried)
2 whole bay leaves
1/2 tablespoon sugar

To taste salt & pepper



Pour tomatoes in a large bowl and crush with your hands. Over medium heat, heat oil in a large pan until hot. Add onion and sauté for 3 to 5 minutes until the onions begin to appear translucent (add salt and pepper). Add the garlic for about 30-60 seconds—do NOT burn. Add the tomatoes, stir to mingle the flavors. Add in the herbs and bay leaves. Sprinkle in sugar, salt and pepper. Lower the heat and simmer for 30 minutes, uncovered. Stir occasionally.

# **A Living Legacy**

Last Summer, We Said "Good-bye" to One of Our Great Residents...

When Paul Bennett passed away last July, there was an immediate outpouring of love from his neighbors here in Ivy Hills. Mr. Bennett was a 50 year resident of Ivy Hills. Neighbor and personal friend, Theresa Kulczad, had the honor of eulogizing Paul Bennett during his memorial service. Here were some of her words:

Our Ivy Hills neighborhood is such a special place. We've all come together and become great friends, with Paul as the glue, the original bridge, the connector, that brought us together. He and his life-long friend, Jim Jordon, were two of the original land-owners in Ivy Hills over 50 years ago, before there was an I-465 and a Castleton Mall. Our circle of friends on Susan Drive East hear about the stories of the great friendships that continue to this day. Neighbors still keep in touch and come to visit Paul from decades ago. It's clear that he and his wife lola touched so many lives.

Paul loved the neighborhood and working in his yard. His lawn is just under an acre and he mowed it every week with a push-mower up until he was 94. For years his wife asked him not to climb on ladders and the roof, and for the past five years, his neighbors begged him not to, too. He was even up on the roof, blowing leaves and cleaning the gutters, at 94. He loved raking leaves and picking up sticks and the neighbor next door was always grateful when he cleaned up her yard, too! Paul was a walker and could always be seen taking daily walks in Ivy Hills, wearing his cap and smoking a pipe. His immediate family lives in Colorado. They had always wanted him to move there, but he remained steadfast in the love of his home on Susan Drive East and Ivy Hills. His last wish was simply to come home.

As friends have talked about Paul, the words that continually come up are: a "true gentleman", "talented", "way smart", "inspirational", and an "amazing guy".

Paul was ALSO very independent and stubborn; he just wouldn't give up. His hope was to go down in his boots, carrying a rake, working in the yard, and smoking his pipe. And the day that he fell twice and broke his hip, that's just about the way it happened.

He often said he thought his life was useless unless he was helping someone. Even just two weeks before he died, when he was in a wheelchair and declining, he said, in a barely audible voice: "Is there anything I can do to help?", as if he was ready to get up and start working on the next project.
