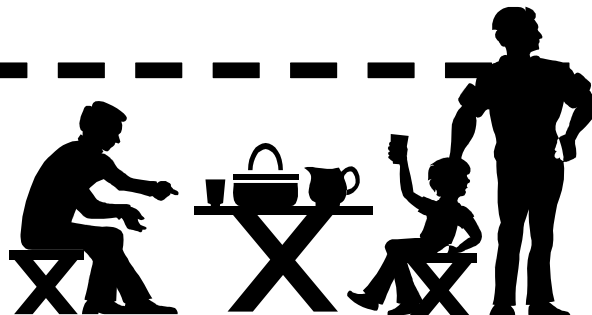

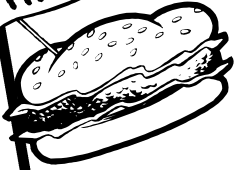

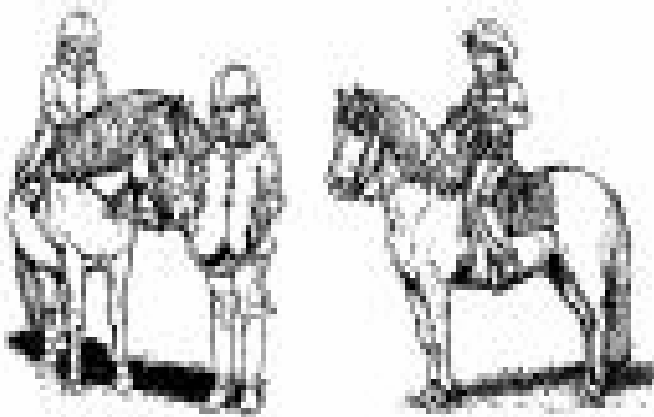

Set Up: arrive 45 minutes early to set up chairs and tables.

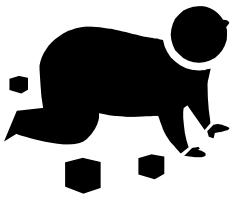
Greeting & Hospitality: Greet neighbors, sign-in sheet, help with name tags and collect dues.

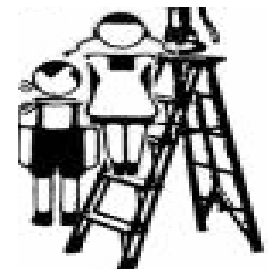

GACC REPORT

The Greater Allisonville Community Council (GACC) is comprised of neighborhoods in the following "border" - south of 82nd Street, west of Binford Blvd., north of Kessler and east of Keystone. It meets the 2nd Tuesday of each month at the Epworth Methodist Church at 65th and Allisonville Road. All Ivy Hills residents are invited and encouraged to attend meetings.

The GACC is chaired by Lori Olivier (Ivy Hills resident). News from GACC since March is summarized briefly in this report.

1.) In March, Ivy Hills long-time resident Don Barr attended the GACC public meeting to announce his candidacy for Washington Township School Board. In April, the GACC hosted a forum of all four candidates running for School Board of Washington Township, Tim George, Mr. Barr, Greg Wright and Don Kite. A very lively exchange of views was presented to those who attended the public meeting.

2.) For the past few months, some residents of the Greater Allisonville Community Council have noted an unusual sign ("Chinese Medicine") affixed to the home located at 8035 Allisonville Road, which is in Ivy Hills. Generally, the GACC is not supportive of large signs advertising any type of personal services or business concerns. The zoning compliance authorities from the City have reviewed the size and placement of the sign, as well as the manner in which this home-run business is being conducted. The sign complies with city regulations.

3.) Petition 2006-ZON-036, 8001 Oak Hill Drive. The past two meetings of the GACC have involved concerns from our neighbors west of us, on Oak Hill Drive (on the north side of Allisonville Road and immediately west of Allisonville School). There is a 4.3 acre parcel of land that one owner is trying to sell to a developer, Brad Davis of Davis Investments. Davis' plan has been to establish 8 one-half acre (approximately) lots with one home on each lot. The other 18 neighbors in Oak Hill, who reside on 31 acres, are very concerned that the small size of the lots anticipated for development by Davis will drastically change the character of that neighborhood. The May GACC involved nearly all of the Oak Hill Residents in attendance to complain about Davis' plans. Brad Davis and his attorney, Mary Solada, attended the meeting also. As of the June GACC meeting, further discussion with Davis was to take place, Mr. Davis and Ms. Solada did not attend the meeting. The owner of the 4.66 acres, Phyllis Wilson, attended the meeting and requested feedback from the Oak Hill residents attending to see if alternatives (to the 0.5 acres lots) might be considered, but no one from Oak Hill wanted to comment at that time. In the meantime, a public hearing is still scheduled for Thursday, July 27 at the City-County building. Assuming that is still on schedule in early July, the GACC will vote on this matter at their July 11th meeting.

4.) Other matters. CVS is planning to build a new store on the southeast corner of Binford and E. 71st Street. This would be the first store to be built in the area which is of such great concern to all residents. The Binford Redevelopment and Growth (BRAG) organization has heard that CVS plans to use an electronic variable messaging sign (EVMS). If they move forward with this request (which would require a zoning variance), GACC is likely to oppose this type of sign.

GACC meetings are the 2nd Tuesday at each month. They meet at Epworth Methodist Church. All Ivy Hills residents are encouraged to attend.

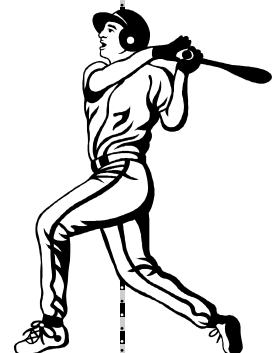
